User Safety Training

Read And Understand Manual

Make sure that anyone who will be operating, maintaining, or working around the unit, reads and understands all the operating, maintenance, and safety information in this manual and other related OEM equipment manuals before operating, maintaining, or working around the unit.



Crush Hazard (Rolling Over)

Do not clean, lubricate, or make adjustments while the unit is moving.



Crush Hazard (Rolling Over)

When disconnecting the unit or leaving the operator's seat:

- Stop the tractor. 1.
- Shut off the engine and remove the ignition key. 2.
- Set the brakes. 3.



Overturn Hazard

Pick the most level route possible when transporting across fields. Avoid the edges of ditches, gullies, or steep hillsides.



Safe Distance

Keep all bystanders, pets, and livestock clear of the work area, particularly when raising or lowering the unit.



Fall Hazard

Do not use this implement as a work platform. Do not stand on

top of the implement at any time. Do not ride on the tractor or the implement or allow others to ride.

Sharp Object Hazard

Do not place any part of your body under the implement. Severe injury will occur if the implement falls on a person.

A WARNING



Enter And Exit Tractor

To avoid being run over, do not enter or exit tractor when it is moving. Avoid serious injury or death, from contact with rotating tires, by entering or exiting tractor only when it is completely stopped.



Never allow inexperienced or untrained personnel to operate the implement or tractor without supervision.

ACAUTION



This is a rear-mounted implement that removes weight from the front wheels of the tractor whenever the implement is raised off the ground. This transfer or decrease of front-end weight can cause loss of steering with possible overturn and personal injury.

To prevent this potential hazard, add front-end weight until at least 20% of tractor's original weight is on the front wheels.

When transporting the implement on rough or uneven surfaces, drive slowly to prevent bouncing and loss of contact of the front wheels and the around.



Safe Distance

Keep all bystanders, especially children, away from the tractor and implement during operation.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Follow all operating, maintenance, and safety instructions found in this manual.



Periodically clear the unit of brush, twigs, or other materials to prevent buildup of dry, combustible materials.



Visually check all fasteners for tightness or damage before and after operation. Repair immediately if required.



Tractor Requirements



AWARNING

Tractor Owner/Operator Manual Always refer to the tractor Operator's Manual to ensure compatibility and maximum safety.

The tractor used to operate the V-blade leveler must have the power to lift and pull the V-blade leveler at a ground speed between 2 and 5 MPH.

Use the chart to select the tractor horsepower appropriate for your V-blade leveler. Do not use a tractor of more than the recommended HP to prevent damaging V-blade leveler components.

A minimum of 20% of the combined tractor and equipment weight should be on the front wheels to ensure adequate stability during transport and operation. Add front end weight as needed to maintain 20% weight on the front axle.

Always review the "controls" section of the tractor Operator's Manual to be familiar with the location, settings, and function of the tractor controls. Be familiar with all controls before using this equipment.

Tractor Safety Devices

If transporting or operating the tractor and implement near a public roadway, the tractor must be equipped with proper warning lighting and a Slow Moving Vehicle (SMV) emblem, which are clearly visible from the rear of the unit. Lights and a SMV emblem must be attached directly to the implement if the visibility of the tractor warning signals is obscured.

Never operate the tractor PTO with the PTO master shield missing or in the raised position.

ROPS and Seat Belt



Rollover Hazard



To avoid serious injury or death from falling off tractor, equipment runover,

rollover, or crushing:

- 1) Use ROPS equipped tractor.
- 2) Keep ROPS locked in the UP position.
- 3) Only operate the equipment when seated in the tractor seat.
- 4) Always fasten seat belt when operating the tractor and V-blade leveler.

The tractor must be equipped with a Roll Over Protective Structure (ROPS) (tractor cab or roll-bar) and seat belt to protect the operator from falling off the tractor, especially during a roll-over where the driver could be crushed and killed. Only operate the tractor with the ROPS in the raised position and seat belt fastened.

3-Point Hitch

These V-blade levelers are designed to be mounted on a tractor CAT II or CAT III 3-Point or Quick Hitch.

Refer to the tractor Operator's Manual for the category of the tractor being used. If the hitch does not conform to ASAE CAT II / III dimensions, the V-blade leveler may not fit or raise properly. Consult an authorized dealer for possible modification procedures to mount nonconforming hitches. Depending on the hitch category, certain size pins are used to attach the implement to the tractor. CAT II hitches require 1-1/8" diameter lower and 1" diameter upper hitch pins. CAT III hitches require 1-7/16" diameter lower and 1-1/4" diameter upper hitch pins.

Install the lift arm stabilizer or shorten the stop chains to place the arms into the non-sway configuration. Refer to the tractor manual for details.



V-Blade Leveler

Attaching to Tractor

Use caution when connecting the V-blade leveler to the tractor. The V-blade leveler should be securely resting on the ground or setting on blocks. Keep hands and feet from under the V-blade leveler and clear of pinch points between the tractor drawbar and V-blade leveler hitch.

AWARNING



Crush Hazard

Do not allow anyone to stand between the hitch and implement during hook-up operations.

- 1. Shorten or remove the tractor drawbar to avoid interference when raising and lowering the V-blade leveler.
- 2. Remove the lynch pins and lift pins.
- 3. Board the tractor and start the engine. Position the tractor with the 3-point lift arms positioned at the same height and aligned with the V-blade leveler hitch pin holes.
- **Note:** Set the 3-point lift control to "Position Control" so that the lift arms maintain a constant height when attaching the V-blade leveler. See the tractor Operator's Manual for correct settings when attaching 3-point equipment.
- 4. Turn off the tractor engine and dismount.
- 5. Insert the hitch pin through the lift arm and lug holes and install the lynch pin.
- 6. Walk around to the opposite side and repeat the procedure for the remaining lift arm and hitch pin.
- 7. Extend or retract the 3-point top link to align its end hole with the hole of the V-blade leveler's top link. Insert the top link hitch pin and insert the retaining pin into the hitch pin.
- 8. Return to the tractor and slowly raise the 3-point lift arms fully up and down to make sure the V-blade leveler does not make contact with the tractor tire, drawbar, or any other equipment on the tractor.
 - a. Move or remove the drawbar if it interferes with the implement.
- 9. Adjust any lower link check chains, guide blocks, or sway blocks to prevent the V-blade leveler from swaying side-to-side.

Setting the V-blade leveler

Properly setting the V-blade leveler is essential for efficient and safe operation. A properly set V-blade leveler will consistently achieve the desired results.

Note: The V-blade leveler must be hitched to the tractor and raised off the ground to make the following adjustments.

A WARNING



Crush Hazard

Make adjustments to the V-blade leveler after it has been properly attached to the tractor and secured with solid supports.

Never work around equipment supported by hydraulics.

Hydraulics can drop equipment instantly if controls are actuated even when power to the hydraulics is shut off.

- 1. Use the adjustment on the tractor 3-point hitch lift arm to level the V-blade leveler from side-to-side.
- 2. Adjust the top link to level the V-blade leveler from front to back.
- In most conditions, the V-Blade Leveler works best when all ground engaging blades are flush and level. To achieve this, set the V-Blade Leveler on a flat, level surface, loosen all blade bolts, including side blades and middle buster, and re-tighten.



4. Initial Setup Checklist

Efficient and safe operation of the V-blade leveler requires that every user read and understand the operational instructions and all related safety instructions outlined in this manual.

This checklist is provided for the user/owner. It is important for both personal safety and to maintain the mechanical condition of the V-blade leveler that this checklist is followed.

Initial Setup Checklist (prior to using for the first time)

Implement Break-In

Although there are no operational restrictions on the V-blade leveler when used for the first time, it is recommended that the following mechanical items be checked:

- 1. After 1/2 hour of operation:
 - a. Check all fasteners and tighten if necessary.
 - b. Make sure that the cutting edges are in good condition.
- 2. After 10 hours of operation:
 - a. Go to the normal servicing and maintenance schedule, as defined in the Maintenance Section.

General Operating Instructions

- Familiarize yourself with the Operation and Parts Manual, and make sure the V-blade leveler is properly attached to the tractor before beginning work. Inspect the condition of the cutting edges and the overall V-blade leveler for potential problems or damage. Do not use the V-blade leveler if it needs repairs of any type.
- 2. Clear the area of bystanders, especially small children. Make sure that you can clearly see and identify passersby, steep slopes, ditches, drop-offs, power lines, debris, and foreign objects. If you are unable to clearly see these type of items, discontinue operating the V-blade leveler.
- 3. Know the location of all underground cables, pipelines, and other hazards in the area. Also make certain that all irrigation heads, utility outlets, and other obstacles are properly marked.
- 4. Watch for low hanging limbs, power lines, and other overhead obstacles while you are operating. Use care to avoid hitting these items.
- 5. Do not operate the V-blade leveler, or drive the tractor into material that is burning, or areas that recently burnt and may contain hot spots. Tire damage can occur when driving over hot material. Oil and grease on the tractor and V-blade leveler could ignite, resulting in equipment destruction.
- Lower the V-blade leveler to the ground and proceed forward at a speed of no more than 2 to 4 MPH. The V-blade leveler should immediately begin shaving the soil surface, and allowing material to flow under the blades to fill in low spots.




V-Blade Leveler

- Depending on surface conditions, a buildup may occur in front of the rear wear plate. If this occurs, raise the V-blade leveler slightly with the 3-point hitch control lever to allow excess material to flow out under the wear plate in an even and level fashion.
- 8. If a buildup occurs in front of the rear blade, raise the trap doors to allow the excess material to flow out of the sides.
- 9. The keyhole mounts can be used to drag a tire behind to feather out the ridges and distribute excess material.
- 10. Slow the tractor when making turns, and remember that the V-blade leveler will swing wide of the tractor when turning.
- 11. Always operate safely and follow all the instructions in this manual.

Berm Scrapers (Optional Equipment)

The berm scrapers (if equipped) can be used to feather out any ridges left at the edge of the implement and distribute excess material.


1. To adjust the vertical spring tension, loosen adjusting nuts (1) on vertical adjusting rod (2) and lengthen or shorten vertical spring (3) to achieve the desired tension.



- 2. Tighten the adjusting nuts.
- 3. To adjust the horizontal spring tension, loosen adjusting nuts (4) on horizontal adjusting rods (5) and lengthen or shorten horizontal spring (6) to achieve the desired tension. Be sure to maintain equal tension on the two horizontal springs.
- 4. Tighten the adjusting nuts.

Detaching From Tractor

- Move the V-blade leveler to a level storage location. Park the tractor, place the transmission in park or neutral, and apply the parking brake. Lower the V-blade leveler, shut down the engine, and remove the key before exiting the tractor.
- 2. Make sure the V-blade leveler is resting securely on the ground or blocks before attempting to disconnect it from the tractor. Use extreme care to keep feet and hands from under the V-blade leveler and clear of any pinch points caused by the tractor hitch arms and V-blade leveler hitch pins.
- 3. Extend or retract the tractor 3-point hitch top link to remove tension on the top link hitch pin. When the pin is loose and easy to rotate, remove the pin from the V-blade leveler.
- 4. Disconnect the lift arms and drive the tractor away from the V-blade leveler.



TRANSPORTING

Transporting Safety (Road)

Refer to "Safety" on page 6 for general transporting safety requirements.

A WARNING

The following safety instructions are provided to help prevent serious injury and possibly even death.

Operating the Tractor

Before attaching the V-blade leveler to the tractor, be familiar with its controls and how to stop quickly in the event of an emergency. Read and understand this manual and the one provided with your tractor before transporting the V-blade leveler.

Loss of Control

A minimum of 20% of the combined tractor and equipment weight should be on the front wheels to ensure adequate stability during transport and operation. To avoid serious injury or death from a loss of control accident, maintain 20% weight on the front wheels. Add front end weight if necessary.

ACAUTION



Beware of physical surroundings and

especially bystanders, particularly children, before moving the unit! This is particularly important with higher noise levels and guiet cabs, as you may not hear people shouting.



NO PASSENGERS ALLOWED - Do not carry passengers anywhere on or in the tractor, except as required for operation.



Do not allow anyone to ride on the implement while it is moving.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

The following safety instructions are provided to help prevent injury or limit equipment damage.

Drive Safely Be a safe and courteous driver. Anticipate what other drivers will do and drive accordingly. Always yield to oncoming traffic in all situations, including narrow bridges, intersections, etc. Plan your route to avoid heavy traffic.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS



Allow Extra Distance

Apply brakes early. Leave extra distance between your vehicle and the one(s) ahead to provide adequate stopping space. Extra distance will be required to stop the vehicle.

Hitch Attachment



Be sure the V-blade leveler is securely attached to the tractor and in good operating condition before transporting.

Working Taillights

Make sure lights on the tractor are working properly.



Additional Lighting

For V-blade levelers without lights, install additional lights on the rear of the tractor to safeguard against rear-end collisions. Daybreak and dusk are particularly dangerous and rear pilot vehicles are recommended. V-blade levelers without lights should be transported on public roads only during daylight hours.

Hazard Flashers

Use hazard flashers on the tractor when transporting unless prohibited by law.

Right-of-Way

When traveling below the posted speed limit, keep to the right and yield the right-of-way to allow faster traffic to pass.

Tractor Owner/Operator Manual

Always refer to the tractor Operator's Manual to determine its compatibility and maximum safety.

Maximum Transporting Speed

Do not exceed 20 MPH when transporting the V-blade leveler. Slow down for corners and rough terrain.



Visibility

Clean reflectors, SMV or SIS sign, and lights before transporting. Make sure

all the lights and reflectors required by highway and transport authorities are in place and can be seen clearly by all overtaking and oncoming traffic.





SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS



Regulations

Make sure all local, state, and federal regulations, regarding the transport of equipment on public roads and highways, are met. Check with the local authorities regarding transporting the V-blade leveler on public roads. Obey all applicable laws and regulations.



When transporting the unit on public roadways, use accessory lights and devices for adequate warning to

operators of other vehicles. Various safety lights and devices are available from your dealer.

Make sure the "Slow Moving Vehicle" placard is clearly visible to vehicles approaching from the rear.



Make sure that the area is clear of children, animals, and other obstacles before moving the unit.

Some localities prohibit the use of flashing amber lights. Local laws should be checked for all highway lighting and marking requirements.

Be observant of bridge load restrictions. Do not cross bridges rated lower than the gross weight at which you are operating.

Watch for overhead obstructions and side clearances while transporting. Remember the implement may be wider than your tractor and extreme care must be taken to allow for safe clearance.

Always operate equipment in a position to provide maximum visibility at all times. Make allowances for increased length and weight of the equipment when making turns, stopping, etc.

Avoid sudden uphill turns on steep slopes.

Operate the tractor from the operator's seat only.

Always keep the tractor in gear to provide engine braking when going downhill. Do not coast.

- 1. Familiarize yourself with the Operation and Parts Manual, and make sure the V-blade leveler is properly attached to the tractor before transporting.
- 2. If units more than 12' wide must be transported on a public road, detach them from the tractor and transport on a trailer.
- 3. Slow the tractor when making turns, and remember that the V-blade leveler will swing wide of the tractor when turning.
- 4. Watch for low hanging limbs, power lines, and other overhead obstacles while you are transporting. Use care to avoid hitting these items.



MAINTENANCE

Personal Safety

Rolling Over / Crush Hazard To prevent serious



Lubrication Points

Bearings come pre-lubed from the factory. Prior to applying grease, allow 40 hours of operation time to break in the seals. Add grease to the zerk fitting on the pillow block bearings on roller models, as shown. Avoid mixing different brands of grease.

Note: Clean the fitting, then add grease until it is visibly forced out of the bearing.



Welding Repairs



Before performing any type of welding repair to the V-blade leveler, contact T. G. Schmeiser Co., Inc. for approval. Repair welding must be done with care and with procedures that may be beyond

the capabilities of the ordinary welder.


Ground Engaging Components

Ground engaging components are subject to abrasion and wear. The slotted mounting holes provide 1" of adjustment, which may be used to compensate for wear. Excessively worn components will require replacement.

Front and Rear Blade Replacement

The front and rear blades can be removed, turned over, and reattached to present a fresh edge. Replace the blades when both sides are worn out. Left and right blades should be replaced at the same time. The blades are sold in pairs. Refer to "V-Blade Leveler Front and Rear Blades" on page 26 to obtain the correct part number.

1. Remove the 5/8 x 1-3/4" plow bolts, 5/8" lock washers, and 5/8 hex nuts.




2. Install the replacement blades using new plow bolts. Tighten the nuts to the proper torque.



Side Wear Blade Replacement

The replacement side wear blade kits contain the front side wear blade, trap door, and rear side wear plate. Left and right blades should be replaced at the same time. Kits are sold in pairs. Refer to "V-Blade Leveler Side Blades" on page 28 to obtain the correct part number.


1. Remove the 1/2 x 1-1/2" carriage bolts, lock washers, flat washers, and nuts.



2. Install the replacement wear blades. Tighten the nuts to the proper torque.

Middle Buster Replacement


 The middle buster can be lowered as it wears. Loosen the 5/8" x 1-3/4" adjustment screws and lower the middle buster. To replace, loosen the 5/8 x 1-3/4" adjustment screws and lower the middle buster until it is free of the unit.



2. Insert the replacement middle buster to the proper height, and tighten the adjustment screws.

Berm Scraper Wear Plate Replacement

1. Remove the four 3/8 x 1-3/4" Grade 5 cap screws and nuts.



2. Install the replacement wear plates. Tighten the nuts to the proper torque.

Bolt Torque Requirements

It is extremely important to apply and maintain proper torque on all bolts. Use a torque wrench to assure the proper amount of torque is being applied to the fastener.

Start all bolts or nuts by hand to prevent cross threading.

Torque figures indicated in the chart are used for nongreased or non-oiled threads unless otherwise specified. Therefore, do not grease or oil bolts or cap screws unless otherwise specified in this manual. When using locking elements, increase torque values by 5%.

The chart gives correct torque values for various bolts and cap screws. Tighten all bolts to the torques specified in the chart unless otherwise noted. Check tightness of bolts periodically, using the bolt torque chart as a guide. Always use replacement bolts with the same Grade markings as the removed bolt.

AWARNING



Equipment Failure

The torque value for bolts and cap screws are identified by their head markings. Replacing higher "Grade" bolts (Grade 5) with lower Grade bolts will lead to equipment failure and can result in injury or death. Always use replacement bolts with the same Grade markings as the removed bolt.

Storage Preparation

After work is completed for a season, perform the following maintenance procedures before storing the implement.

- 1. Apply a thin layer of grease or rust preventative to all exposed metal surfaces of the adjustable mechanisms (threaded rods, etc.).
- 2. Check all bolted connections. Ensure that the fasteners are tight, and all retaining pins are secured in place with appropriate retaining clips.
- 3. Inspect the frame for structural fractures.
- 4. Check the leveler blades and wear plates for wear and damage. If excessively worn or damaged, they must be replaced.
- 5. Make sure all the warning decals are in place and legible. Replace any worn decals as needed.

- 6. Thoroughly wash the V-blade leveler with a pressure washer or water hose to remove all dirt, mud, or debris.
- 7. For models equipped with a rear roller, lubricate the grease fittings on the roller pillow block bearings with a good general purpose lithium grease. Refer to "Lubrication Points" on page 20 for the location of the fittinas.
- 8. To help prevent corrosion, remove rust and apply a coat of paint to frame surfaces where paint has been worn off or damaged.
- 9. Make sure the implement is stored in an area with a firm and level base to prevent it from tipping or sinking into the ground. For best results, always store the V-Blade Leveler in a dry, protected location. Leaving this implement unprotected will shorten the service life.

Placing In Storage

- 1. Select an area that is dry, level, and free of debris (inside a building is ideal). Move the V-Blade Leveler to its storage area.
- 2. Lower the V-Blade Leveler onto blocks.
- 3. Disconnect the V-Blade Leveler from the 3-point hitch and drive the tractor away from the V-Blade Leveler. Refer to "Detaching From Tractor" on page 16. Do not leave the tractor attached to the V-Blade Leveler.

Removing From Storage

Prior to use each season, perform the following inspection and maintenance.

- 1. Read the operator's manual to review all safety, operational, and maintenance procedures.
- 2. Perform any recommended maintenance that was not completed when the implement was put into storage.
- Visually inspect the implement for wear or damage.
- 4. Make sure all the warning decals are in place and legible. Replace any damaged or missing decals.
- 5. Attach the V-Blade Leveler to the tractor 3-point hitch. Refer to "Attaching to Tractor" on page 14.
- 6. Raise the V-Blade Leveler up off the blocks.


